ACTION ALERT

Scattered flurries and snow showers risk begin this evening. We may see some lighter rain showers mixed with snow flakes or a few pellets around sundown. Showers will fall in the form of all snow as we progress through the evening and especially overnight. Snow activity will favor non-paved surfaces due to the warmer ground temperatures. There is a potential that it could cover over sidewalks, parking garages and colder paved surfaces. Field Managers will be out monitoring conditions this evening and during the overnight hours and will provide services as conditions warrant.
