ACTION ALERT

Scattered activity will evolve into a more widespread area of snow with the arrival of a clipper system this afternoon into this evening. Snowfall between all of these periods amounts to an inch or two, of fluff spread out in a repeated but manageable fashion through the night. The main "peak" for this will be around into part of the overnight, lessening to flurries 11 PM - 2 AM as always flurries will likely linger afterwards. The break in this relative lull is not long, as another larger system moves in Friday night, this time likely bringing a more appreciably plowable round of fluffy snow into the day Saturday.

Field managers will be out and checking their properties at the onset of this early activity to see if things begin to stick.

Zero tolerance crews will be dispatched during the early evening hours and throughout the overnight to treat all properties so conditions are safe for the start of Friday's workday. If conditions change and begin to cover earlier teams will be dispatch immediately.
