ACTION ALERT

Scattered light snow showers continue this evening and turn more widespread 2 - 4 AM Monday morning. This first shot will generally be on the light side, leaving more scattered coatings - 0.5" through Monday morning before gradually tapering off. We then will watch how a few lake effect snow bands develop off to the east. These try to push west late morning/midday, though with lake effect, the extent of these bands are always tricky to pinpoint. The greatest risk for moderate to heavy snow with these bands will be areas east of the I-355 corridor, where 1"+/hr rates and localized white out conditions are possible. These bands will weaken by the evening and push east, though one last final shot of snow develops once more in the evening, and can last through and into Tuesday AM. In all, about 0.5 - 4.0" as a final storm total is expected and amounts will vary with the heavier lake effect banding during the day.

Lake enhancement totals have the potential to produce with this storm: 6-12" particularly around the City of Chicago to along and southeast of I55 & Eastern Will County / 2-4" Dekalb & McHenry Counties / 2-6" Kane, DuPage, Kendall, Western Will / 4-7" Lake County / Up to 2" Northwest Indiana & Rockford.

Zero tolerance crews are currently servicing 24 hour emergency type facilities, our remaining crews will be dispatched during the overnight hours as intensity picks up around the 2-3am period in order to service properties for the start of Mondays workday.
