## **ACTION ALERT**

Today was a nice day with plenty of sunshine but the clouds will build back in tonight from a system that is mostly passing to our south. This system will clip our southern regions during the morning hours on Friday and should exit by 12-1 PM. The greatest potential for around 1" is near and south of I-80 corridor.

Zero tolerance crews that handle regions south of I90 will be out during the early morning hours applying a deicing application before the start of the business day. For regions north of I90 our field managers will be onsite monitoring conditions and will proceed with a deicing application if conditions warrant.
