# **ACTION ALERT**

A band of snow is pushing through the area this evening and should exit prior to midnight. A snow squall has developed that can put down heavy bursts of snow of ½"-1" within a short period of time and can cause near blinding conditions for visibility. Highest amounts are expected around Rockford and McHenry County with the remainder of our area mostly under an inch. We have experienced a lot of blowing snow this afternoon and that will continue into the overnight hours when winds decrease tomorrow morning to 8-18 mph. Currently winds are 15-30 mph with gusts of 35-45 mph. Crews have been dispatch to handle tonight's activity and to preform additional scraping, corning and curbing that will be necessary due to all the blowing and drifting snow.
