



STORM SUMMARY 3-10 & 11-22

An upper level system generated a band of snow from the southern plains into the local area late afternoon on 3-10 to the morning of 3-11. The highest snow totals with this event were over east central Illinois into Indiana. Even though air temperatures from the start of the event were subfreezing, the subsurface temperatures were in the mid 30's which resulted in initially wet pavement conditions. As temperatures continued to fall overnight hardscape surfaces did receive coverage. Zero tolerance crews were dispatch in all areas to deice sidewalks and parking areas, further south several regions needed plowing services as well. O'Hare officially had 0.9" snow, Romeoville 2.1", MDW 1.6" and Rockford 0.2".
