ACTION ALERT

Zero Tolerance crews have already been dispatched for all regions to pre-treat and handle the initial precipitation that has caused a very small amount of icing. The forecast will be a tricky one as the surrounding area will see many different types of precipitation. The ground temperature is very cold so even with temps rising above freezing tonight there could be icing issues with the water freezing from the ground up. This could take multiple salting applications to address as the water can just rapidly refreeze within minutes of the application. A transition to mostly liquid will occur quickest near I80 corridor by late afternoon/early evening. This should also be the case for the Plainfield/Joliet areas. The further north you go this changeover will occur closer to 6-8pm. Within the winter storm warning area the precipitation will remain mostly snow. Many areas within the north and west of the Chicagoland area may need plowing operations as the backside of the storm will move back to snow and produce accumulation.

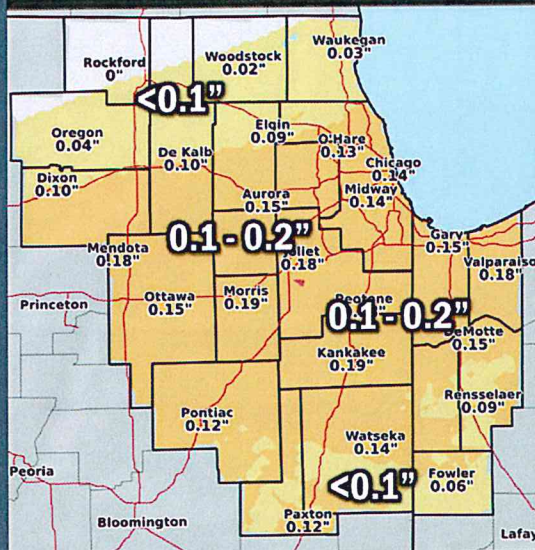

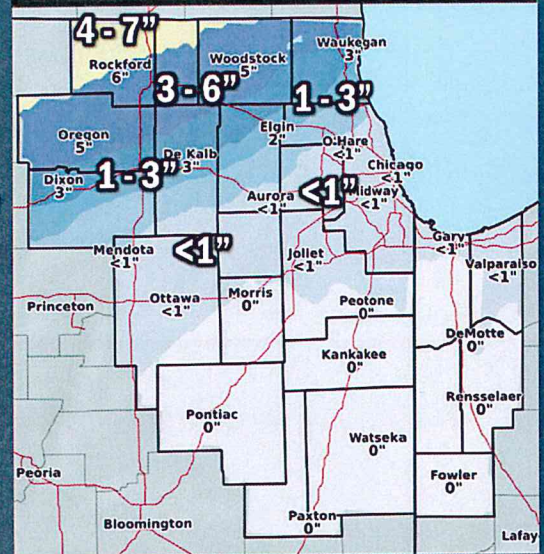

Forecast Snowfall - Through Tonight -



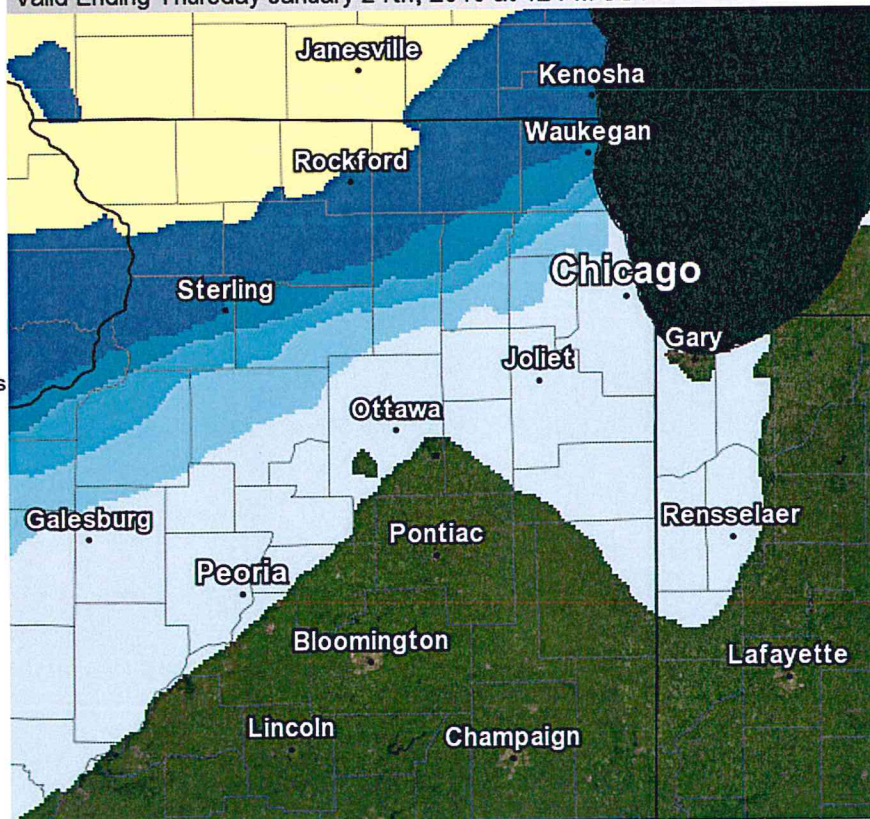
