ACTION ALERT

A very potent clipper type system is now over southeastern Saskatchewan. It will zip southeastward moving across northern Illinois Monday am. There are some discrepancies with the track with a couple of models hinting at a further north track across southern WI. That would result in lower totals areawide with higher totals expected in Wisconsin. As temperatures inch up tonight the snow will be wetter than recent snows. Heaviest snowfall will be 11pm to around 4pm for Rockford area and 1am to 6am for Chicago. Snow may mix with or change to some freezing drizzle 8-11am Monday. Then there could be a lull till mid afternoon and a little wraparound of light snow or flurries mid afternoon into early Monday night. Blowing and drifting snow late tonight and pm Monday into Tuesday with record breaking and life threatening low temperatures to follow the storm Tuesday through Thursday.

Plowing operations will begin as conditions warrant and continue overnight and into Monday morning. Operations will continue during the day, we will clean properties to the best of our abilities working around vehicles and pedestrians. Late evening and overnight clean up Monday pm/Tuesday am will be needed to plow and deice surfaces once again while properties are closed. Apartment/hotel locations "Day After Plow Clean Up" will occur on Tuesday.

For all 2" and over Multifamily complexes; we will start clearing driveways during the early morning hours just before the heavy intensities slow down. Clearing operations will continue throughout Monday until all driveways are cleared. Sidewalks are always a secondary priority to roadways, cul-de-sacs and driveways and are to be completed once at the end of the overall event.

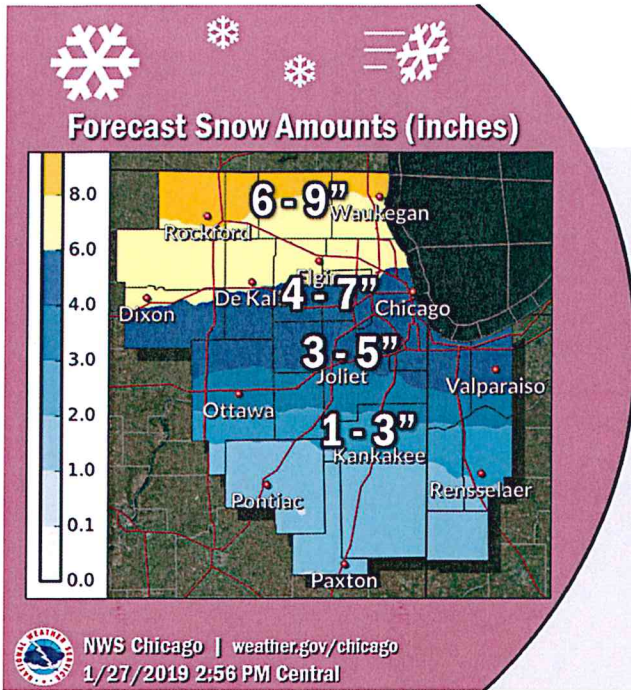

- When**
 Start: This evening from west to east
 Heavy Snow Ends: Early Mon morning
 Rest of Mon: Light snow, freezing drizzle
- Snow**
 Rates: 1"+/hr overnight-early Mon (12-7am)
 Lighter the rest of Monday
- Impacts: HIGH overnight & early Mon a.m.**
- Very low visibility later tonight
 - Significantly slowed travel into Mon a.m. commute, blowing snow possible
- Actions**
- Use extreme caution traveling.
 - Avoid overexertion when shoveling after storm.
