ACTION ALERT

Models are showing a transition to plain snow west to east 4-6pm along with a potential 2-3 hour period of moderate to heavy snow. The bulk of our accumulation will occur between 6-7pm to 11pm. On average the central region should see 2-4 inches and we might even see 3-5 inches for northern Lake County. South of I80 we'll look for up to 2 inches. Pavement temperatures will continue to drop with the occurrence of snow this afternoon and evening. There will also be a period of snow Sunday night from 9-10pm till around 3am this should mainly be focused on Northern Illinois from Rockford to northern Lake County.

What and When:

- Moderate snow from roughly 5-11pm this evening across northeast IL & northwest IN, with a **period of heavy snow possible**
- Strong N to NE winds producing blowing snow and significantly reduced visibility and blowing snow this evening

Impacts:



- Minor impacts from icing northwest of I-55 late morning into the afternoon
- A brief period of hazardous conditions this evening due to snow and wind

- Plan ahead for potential travel impacts

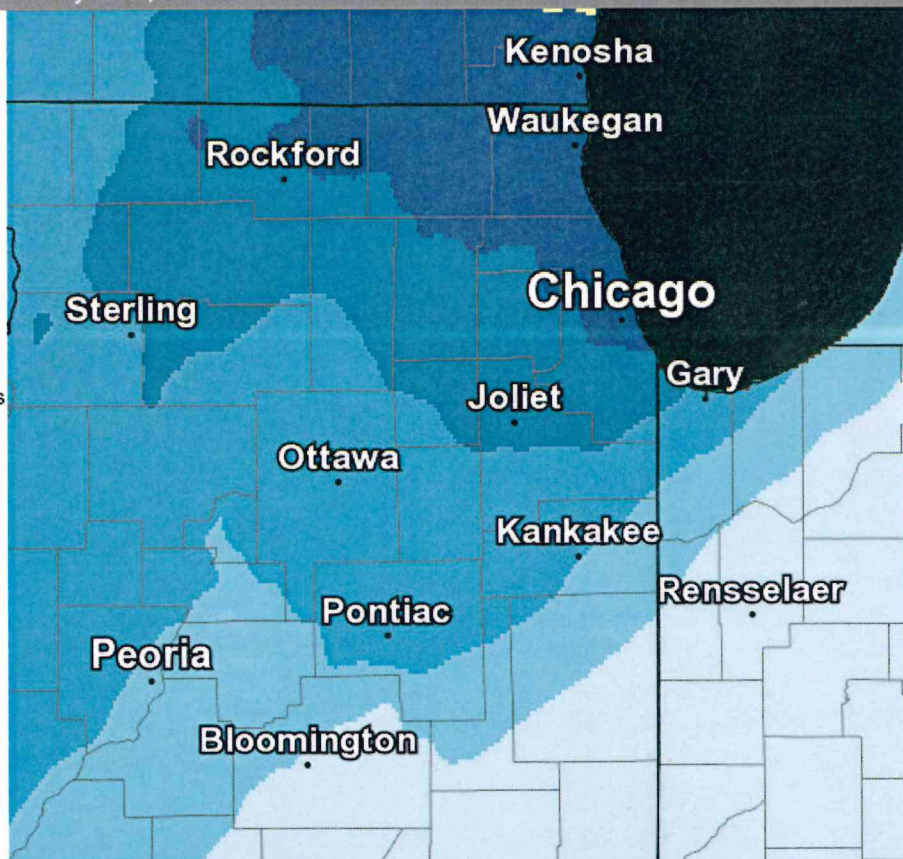
