





STORM SUMMARY 12-30 & 31-19

A strong upper level weather system over the western Great Lakes produced some periods of light snow, flurries and snow showers that entered the area late afternoon on the 30th till 5-7am on the 31st. Falling temperatures to below freezing early evening on the 30th, produced slippery traveling conditions throughout the area, all zero tolerance properties received a deicing application to head off the dropping temperatures and the light coating that covered all hardscape areas by 7pm. Plowing services were dispatch during the early morning hours to scrap all parking lots. Snow amounts ranged from a coating in the south suburbs to around a couple of inches in the northern suburbs. Winds gusted 35-45 mph which resulted in areas of blowing snow creating larger snow drifts. Officially O'Hare had 1.5" inches, Rockford 1.7" inches, 1.1" inches Midway and .4" inches at Romeoville.
