



## STORM SUMMARY 2-12 & 13-20

Light snow spread into the area between 2-4 pm on the 12<sup>th</sup> and diminished 12-2pm on the 13<sup>th</sup>. This was another long duration event. Average snowfall totals were 2-5 inches.

Heaviest snow was towards the south and lightest in the northwest. This was an event that came in waves. During the early morning hours surfaces were able to get completely plowed and salted, around 6am another wave came through for a few hours that put down an additional 1-2 inches. We began plowing and shoveling all properties again as the beginning of the work day started. Rapidly falling temperatures from the low 30s to the teens between 3-5 pm resulted in flash freezing conditions on surfaces. Clean up procedures took place during the overnight hours plowing all areas of properties where vehicles were present. Additional salting and deicing treatments were applied to create a safe environment for the start of Friday's very cold work day where the real temperature low was -7 degrees. Officially O'Hare had 3.5", Rockford 2.4", Romeoville 3.9" The O'Hare season total is 25.2"
