ACTION ALERT

This much anticipated storm has largely decrease in amounts for the immediate Chicagoland area as the storm track has continued to push further south. Temperatures are currently above freezing and will remain so into this evening. The initial precipitation will not begin to accumulate until after 8pm. All zero tolerance and icy conditions properties will be serviced as conditions warrant, for our Southern region plowing will begin at 1" and for our Central and Northern regions any 1" or 2" triggers will be monitored and we will be taking measurements throughout the overnight hours to see if thresholds are achieved. There will be a low of 28 degrees overnight with a high of 31 degrees during the day on Wednesday.
