# ACTION ALERT

Pavement temperatures are running around 38 degrees but will decrease around dusk and with the onset of snow. Light snow spreads in from South to North. The majority of the snow accumulation will be occurring tonight with most areas only receiving less than one inch during the day on Thursday. We are also looking at the potential for some lake effect activity Thursday night/Friday early morning especially for Cook County and Northwest Indiana. Zero tolerance crews have already been dispatch for our southern regions and all central regions will be arriving onsite around 5pm to prepare for the incoming activity. Plowing operations will commence once areas begin to accumulate around 1" of snow on parking surfaces. Our 2" Multifamily properties we will be onsite taking measurements and tracking to see when thresholds are achieved and dispatch accordingly.
