



## STORM SUMMARY 2-5 & 6 & 7-20

Snow spread into Grundy, Will and Southern Cook county 3-5 pm on the 5<sup>th</sup> before moving into the rest of the area 6-9 pm. Rockford had very small amounts for the entire event and was mostly taken care of with just salting. The snow turned into lake effect activity late afternoon and evening on the 6<sup>th</sup> and this activity shriveled up by 5 am on the 7<sup>th</sup> on the Illinois side of the lake. The lake effect continued till midday over northwest Indiana on the 7<sup>th</sup>. The initial burst of snow was the heaviest as 2-4 inches of snow fell over parts of eastern Will and southern Cook Counties and over into northwest Indiana on the 5<sup>th</sup> compared to 1-3 inches over the remainder of the area for the duration of the event. Treated surfaces from mid morning till the evening were mainly wet. The lake effect activity from the evening on the 6<sup>th</sup> till predawn on the 7<sup>th</sup> were generally up to an inch over parts of Lake, Cook and Will counties. O'Hare had 1" of snow on the 5<sup>th</sup> and 1.4" on the 6<sup>th</sup> and .2 on the 7<sup>th</sup> for a total of 2.6". Rockford had a trace for the whole event. Romeoville had 1.3" on the 5<sup>th</sup>, 2.8" on the 6<sup>th</sup> and a trace on the 7<sup>th</sup> for a total of 4.1". Midway had a total of 4.2".
